

Passion: Started by families for families; impassioned teachers and staff






WE HELP ALL CHILDREN
WITH HEARING LOSS

Child's Voice is the only listening and spoken language program for young children with hearing loss in Northern Illinois.

Children and families get a full spectrum of hearing services from Child's Voice, from diagnosis through support after graduation, and from birth through adulthood.

Our focus on language learning means graduates have acquired vocabulary and articulation skills that are often more developed than their mainstream peers. They are confident and prepared for a lifetime of learning and possibilities.





EARLY INTERVENTION

141 children birth-age 3 received listening and spoken language services last year.

They were served at both
Wood Dale and Chicago locations and
through home-based therapy.
Parent education and coaching was
directly provided to 280 parents/caregivers
and over 100 additional family members
including parents, siblings, and
grandparents.

Due to increased referrals, two staff members became initial evaluators last year, allowing our team to support and qualify families for Early Intervention services as soon as possible.








# GOOD NEWS FROM EARLY INTERVENTION

98% of children showed an improvement in their auditory-skill development.

80% of children improved their language scores. This is a challenge for our students as they enter the program with little to no initial language skills.

90% of children improved their vocabulary. a critical building block for literacy and reading.



#### SCHOOL PROGRAM

We welcomed 33 students in our School Program this year. Nine graduates went on to different schools after meeting their goals at Child's Voice.




# SEE WHAT WE CAN DO TOGETHER!


Our students have been able to learn more through hands-on experiences with the help of the STREAMM program through science kits, visitors, musical performances, and much more

We have been able to see an increase in our students' understanding of music, instruments, confidence and music vocabulary. Our students have been able to play musical instruments at our winter festival with only 4 months of learning.

In the garden, we have been able to create and maintain a butterfly, sensory and vegetable garden. Our students have received hands on experience with planting, growing, and creating food and experiences within the three gardens.

We are able to provide a comprehensive SEL program that teaches our students about their bodies, their emotions, and how we can regulate them.











#### SUPPORT SERVICES

Our students also work diligently to develop self-advocacy skills, becoming their own advocate and champion.

Staff visit students in the mainstream for 3-5 years after graduation and evaluate them not only on academic performance but also how well graduates have adjusted to the classroom.

Child's Voice alumni receive audiology services for life after graduation. But they also visit during school breaks to report on their success.

#### AUDIOLOGY

The Audiology Center provides on-site support for students in the Early Intervention and School programs. This allows teachers and therapists to focus on skill-building with students. Our audiologists also test and diagnose pediatric patients referred to us.

In the 2022-2023 academic year, the Audiology Center:

Supported 240 pediatric patients and families.

- Provided diagnostic testing to 36 infants/newborns at risk for hearing loss. The average age of diagnosis was 8.6 weeks.
- Welcomed back 30 Child's Voice alumni for checkups and device support.

Dr. Dawn Violetto, Director of Audiology, attended the Phonak National Sales meeting! with alumni. The Wayman and Goodwin families shared how Phonak products and hearing technology have impacted them.







# AUDIOLOGY HIGHLIGHTS

The Audiology and Early Intervention teams now offer co-therapy via Zoom when needed.

This has allowed us to improve a family's comfort with their child's device. Therapists work to ensure better use of the hearing aid/cochlear implant in that speech session and at-home outside of sessions.

A collaboration with a local educational co-op to provide audiology testing, device support, and services throughout the school year will allow us to increase the reach of Child's Voice programs and better support more children that are already in their schools.
